Community Pharmacies: How pharmacies can help you

- Medication procurement/advice
- As of January 2023, pharmacists in Ontario can prescribe medications for minor ailments, including:
 - Allergic rhinitis

- Candidal stomatitis (oral thrush)
- Conjunctivitis (bacterial, allergic, and viral) Dermatitis (atopic, eczema, allergic and contact)

- Dysmenorrhea

- Gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD)

- Hemorrhoids

- Insect bites and urticaria (hives)
- Tick bites, post-exposure prophylaxis to prevent Lyme disease
- Musculoskeletal sprains and strains
- Urinary tract infections (uncomplicated)

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Patients are encouraged to speak to their pharmacist to find out what healthcare services they offer and whether they are right for their needs. Having the legislated authority to prescribe for minor ailments does not mean all pharmacists must offer or provide this service.

- Broken bones and dislocated joints
- Facial lacerations
- Vaginal bleeding with pregnancy
- Slurred speech
- Serious burns
- Fever with a rash
- Seizures
- Mental health crisis
