

## Partnership Highlights

#### **Ontario Health Teams**

BGH is a participant in the Lanark, Leeds and Grenville Ontario Health Team (LLG OHT), which is in the planning stages. This collaboration will include partners from all three sectors, including home and community, primary care, and hospitals. These partners will enable the full spectrum of health services.

#### **COVID-19** assessment centre

To keep our community safe and to help to contain the spread of the COVID-19 virus, an assessment centre was established in Brockville. BGH is proud to work with the Leeds, Grenville and Lanark District Health Unit, Upper Canada Family Health Team, Leeds Grenville Community Family Health Team, Athens District Family Health Team, and Prescott Family Health Team.

#### Lanark, Leeds Grenville Addictions and Mental Health

A corporate services arrangement with Lanark, Leeds and Grenville Addictions and Mental Health (LLGAMH) allows us to deliver the best care for people living in our communities with addictions and mental health issues. BGH provides back-office services to LLGAMH, and has also provided support in training and education to ensure the LLGAMH staff were prepared to keep themselves and their clients safe during the COVID-19 pandemic.



### **Team Well-Being Highlights**

#### Workplace culture

In late 2019, healthcare workers felt an increased work-load associated with the increased patient volumes. In addition, there was (and remains) an increase in work-loads in preparation to open our new patient tower. Staff are also tasked with working with aging equipment and technologies.

Despite these challenges, a pulse engagement survey in spring 2019 showed a 16 per cent increase, jumping to 77 per cent satisfaction.

The COVID-19 pandemic has proved to our community and the Hospital that we have an incredibly talented, compassionate workforce. BGH remains committed to investing in our people to be the best at what we do.

#### Mental health of healthcare workers during COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic has increased stress and anxiety on healthcare providers. BGH implemented on-site, peer support to provide immediate resources to help staff and physicians manage their wellness. Most consultations have been tracked to identify how we can better support staff in the future. In a May 2020 report, it showed,

- 194 healthcare workers accessed the onsite support,
- 132 reported anxiety/stress as their biggest concern,
- 54 reporting grief as their primary concern.


BGH's Mental Health Crisis Team, social workers and spiritual care coordinator provided this service. The team believes that self-identified concerns are being underreported, and they continue to connect with staff and physicians regularly.

#### As one of the most efficient hospitals in Ontario, BGH presents a surplus budget.



## New patient tower opening in fall 2020

#### Patients will begin receiving care in our new tower in fall 2020.

Our new, 5-floor, 93-bed patient tower will be 175,000 square feet, doubling the size of the facility currently located at our Charles Street site. BGH will close it's Garden Street site and return the building to the Sisters of Providence.

The new tower will include:

- Mental Health and Addictions Program 29 beds
- Inpatient Rehabilitation and Restorative Care Programs 32 beds
- Complex Continuing Care/Palliative Care Programs 32 beds

To provide the best patient experience, 80% of patient rooms will be private and newly designed windows will allow patients to view the outdoors from their beds. Each level will also have an outdoor courtyard space.

Accessing the new building will also be easier, with a dedicated bus lane and a patient pick up/drop off zone. There will be two new, accessible entrances off Pearl Street and Ormond Street.

## \$9.93 million funding increase for 2019-2020

In May 2020, the Honorable Steve Clark, MPP of Leeds—Grenville—Thousand Islands and Rideau Lakes announced \$9.93 million in new funding for Brockville General Hospital (BGH). This funding gives us the opportunity to invest in our dedicated staff, physicians and volunteers, empowering them to continue to deliver the safe, quality care.

The winners of this historical announcement are the people in our community who rely on our health care services and the dedicated staff, physicians and volunteers who are the heart and soul behind this care.

At an announcement in October, Jim Cooper, Chair of the Board of Directors and Nick Vlacholias, President and CEO of BGH were joined with MPP Clark and area hospital CEOs, Dr. Barry Guppy, President and CEO, Perth and Smiths

Falls District Hospital Frank Vassallo, CEO, Kemptville District Hospital to celebrate increased funding in our communities.

"The Ministry of Health and MPP Steve Clark have shown us that the health and well-being of residents in Leeds Grenville and Lanark is a priority. A 15 per cent funding increase is a testament to the work of the incredible heroes at BGH. I'm proud and grateful to all of the staff and doctors who work tirelessly to help the sick and injured in our community. The past few months, during the COVID-19 pandemic, has taught all of us how important our health is. We are fortunate to have a strong community hospital."
